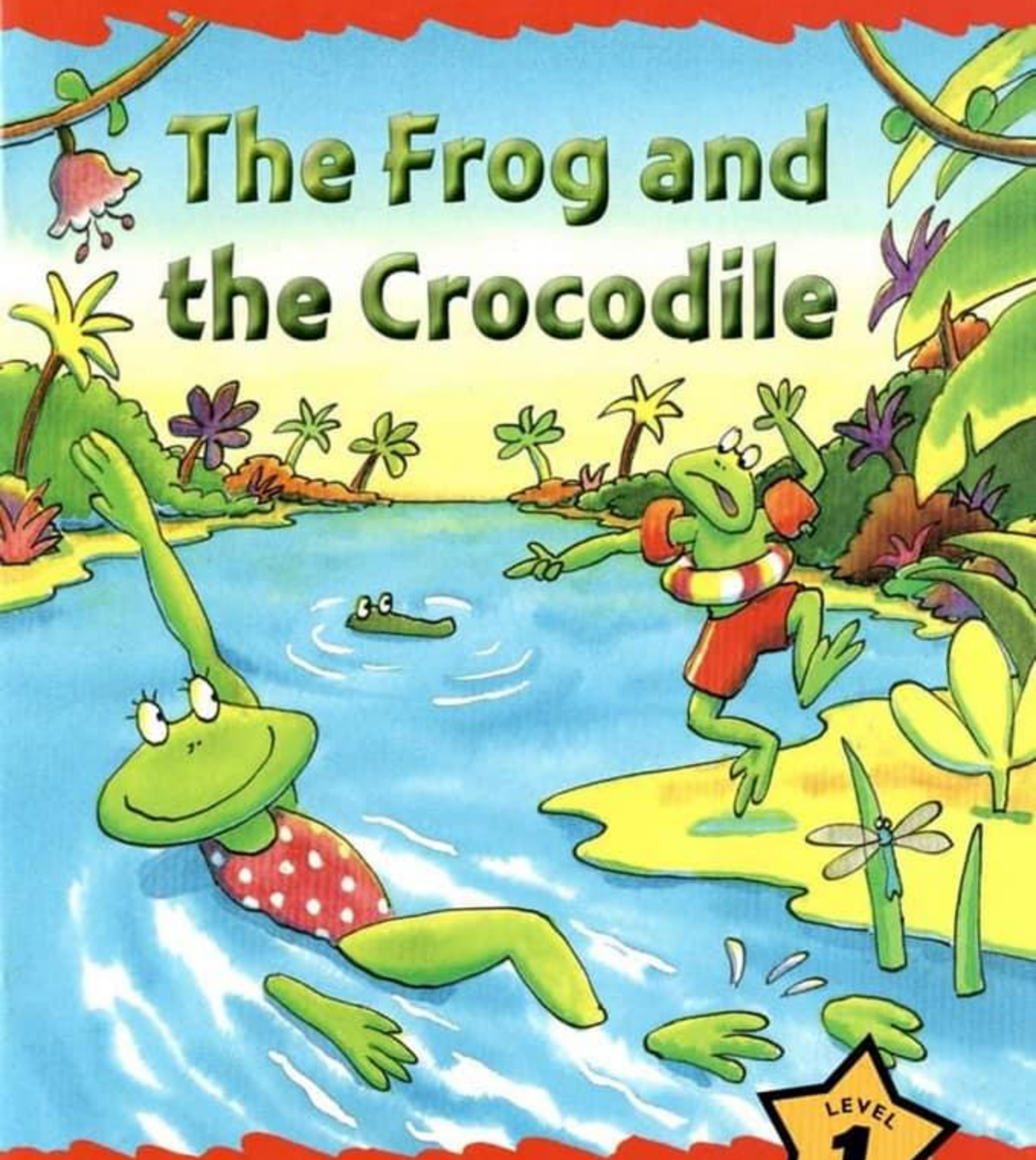

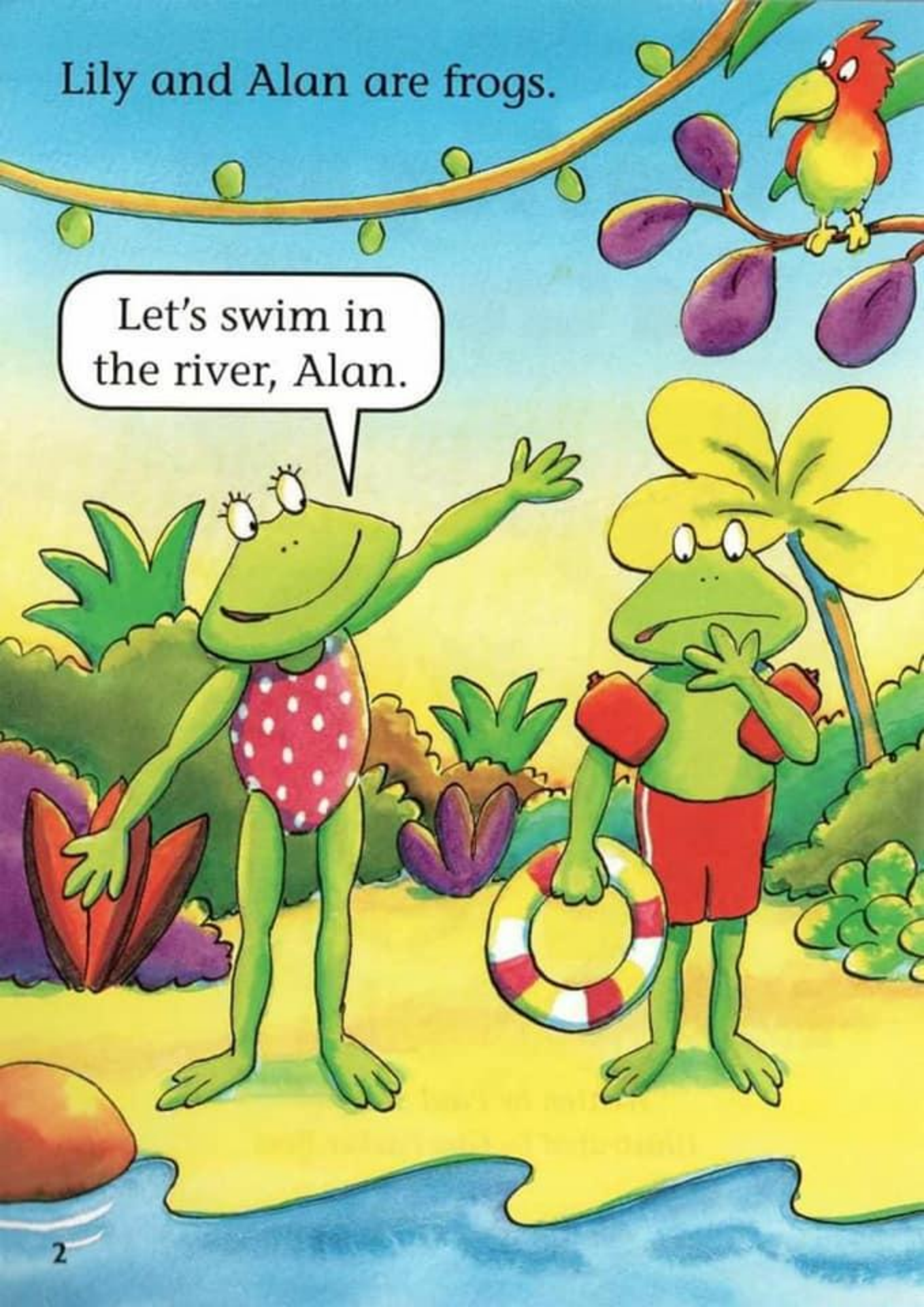
# The Frog and the Crocodile






Lily and Alan are frogs.

Hello, Lily.








Wait! What's that?

a crocodile?



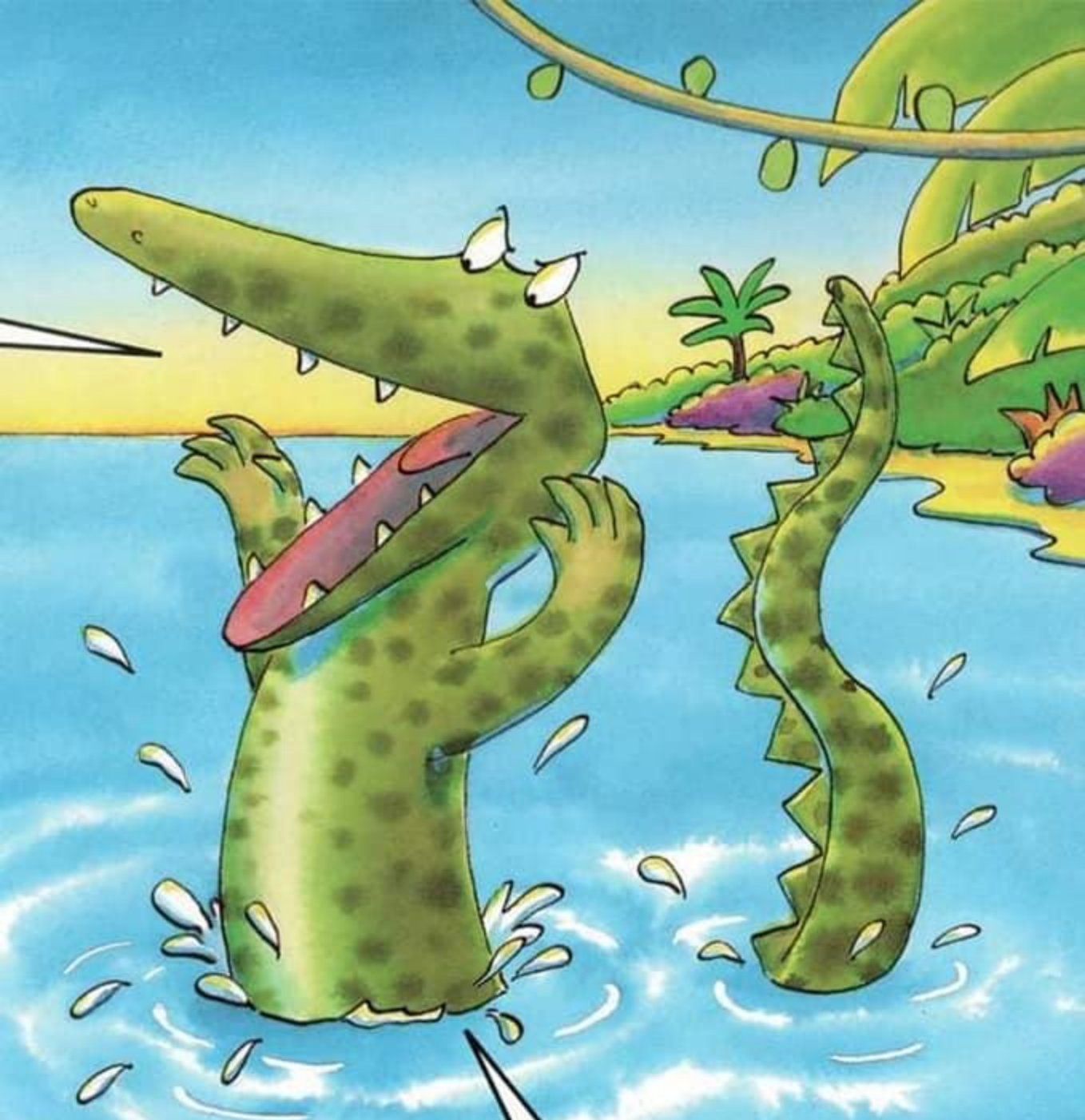


Help! It is

I like frogs for lunch.


I'm not afraid!

with my long tail.






Have you got a

No, I haven't.






I've got a big mouth, too!
